


- Slow down to ensure that ALL Community

Air District / Community Health / AB 617: Community Health Protection Program






Learn about the Air District's Community Health Protection Program to implement Assembly Bill 617.

The Air District is excited to expand our robust efforts to reduce community exposure to air pollutants. The Community Health Protection Program works with Bay Area communities to plan and implement Assembly Bill 617 (C. Garcia, Chapter 136, Statutes of 2017). This collaborative initiative will employ proven and innovative strategies to improve community health by reducing exposure to air pollutants in neighborhoods most impacted by air pollution.

Air District staff are working closely with the California Air Resources Board, other local air districts, community groups, community members, environmental organizations, regulated industries, and other key stakeholders to reduce harmful air pollutants. Through the Community Health Protection Program, we are working together to ensure that everyone benefits from our air quality efforts, especially those who live in areas of the San Francisco Bay Area most impacted by air pollution. 




Many of the Neighborhoods in Red Are Still in the Top 25% Most Disadvantaged Communities






What is CBE?

- Communities for a Better Environment (CBE) is one of the nation's first organizations dedicated solely to environmental justice.
- Beginning in the 1970's in the midst of the environmental movement, CBE began in Chicago and officially launched in the Bay Area in 1978.



CBE Triad Model

- CBE works off of a triad model with environmental justice efforts at the center.
- Community organizing, legal advocacy, and science & research are all used together to push for justice and a just transition.






CBE members demonstrate how to monitor air quality at AB&I during a Land Use and Built Environment Tour of East Oakland.




How Did CBE Decide to Play a Lead Role?

- Initially, CBE opposed AB 617
- 2019 Met with membership and created a draft work plan to share with BAAQMD
- Held extensive meetings about the benefits and challenges of AB 617
 - Capacity
 - Funding
 - Timeline



Timeline Of Conversations with BAAQMD on AB 617



May - June

CBE meets with allies to prep for meeting with BAAQMD

CBE agrees to play role as lead organization with BAAQMD

July

CBE holds contract negotiations, budget discussions, & feedback on nomination process through October

August

CBE begins to meet with technical staff on monitoring and research

CBE staff & members present support for 617

September

Mykela Patton provides first "youth" perspective on East Oakland to the Community Equity, Health and Justice Committee

October


CBE continues to work with technical staff on monitoring and research

Board votes to officially nominate East Oakland

Review from Last Meeting: Agreement on Interim Voting Process

- From last meeting: Majority, more than 50%
- For Co-Chairs: 3 votes for each Steering Committee member, including 1 vote for a youth co-chair



Action Item: Vote on Proposed Co-Chair Nomination & Election Process

After November meeting

- 11/28: CSC members submit responses to Co-Chair questionnaire based on criteria that CSC members voted on via a google form.
- 12/2: Responses will be submitted to CSC in advance for review

December meeting

- CSC will hear 2-minute speech from Co-Chair candidates (proposed by CBE/BAAQMD)
- CSC votes. Each CSC member has 3 votes, 1 for youth and 2 for adults. Majority (more than 50% of CSC members present) wins

After December meeting

• Just Cities will coordinate to schedule preparation meetings with new Co-Chairs

Proposed Roles & Responsibilities of Steering Committee Co-Chairs

- Provide CSC leadership and guidance along with CBE staff
 - 1-2 orientation meetings with Air District & CBE staff & Just
 Cities
- Help plan CSC agendas, facilitate breakout sessions and discussions
 - Meet multiple times per month with Air District & CBE staff to prepare for CSC meetings (including agendas) (about 5 hours of meetings per month *in addition* to monthly CSC meetings)
- Provide direction for Air District & CBE to develop Community Emissions Reduction Plan

Additional stipend of \$75 per/hr for each Co-chair to compensate for participation in meetings



Proposed Criteria/Qualifications/Experience for Serving as Effective CSC Co-Chairs

 Top-to-bottom understanding of what the job is and the vision. Not easily persuaded. Not afraid of conflict. 	 Experience working effectively with racially/culturally/linguistically/ generational diverse people; Experience resolving conflicts in healthy and productive ways; Good listener; Experience managing large group dynamics; Demonstrated commitment and service to the East Oakland community
