



Charter Development

- Charter is the first milestone in the CERP Timeline and required by CARB
- Charter sets the committee process and structure and should include the following:
 - Committee objectives
 - Roles & responsibilities
 - Meeting frequency
 - Meeting dates, times and locations to ensure accessibility
 - Use of facilitation services
 - Use of interpretation services at CSC meetings and broader public outreach efforts

Charter Development

How did we get to the first draft?

- Reviewed <u>CARB's Blueprint</u> for Charter requirements. The Blueprint refers to the program's process for meeting AB 617's requirements to develop a CERP
- Reviewed best practices for other AB 617 communities (including <u>West</u>
 <u>Oakland</u> and <u>Richmond/San Pablo</u>) and samples from throughout the State
- Solicited feedback on draft outline and draft Charter from co-leads and cochairs
