





Process is community-developed, to build trusting relationships and authentic participation.

DEVELOP CHARTER

Focus on Steering Committee membership and decision-making process within the draft charter.



DESIGN TEAM MADE IT HAPPEN

Team designed summit to shape the co-led steering committee process and to ensure committee meets community needs.

COMMUNITY SUMMIT DESIGN TEAM

- 11 individuals from community-based organizations, community groups, and residents
- Designed and implemented the Saturday, February 16th summit
- Developed draft criteria, balance and membership of the Steering Committee & its decision-making framework
- Developed draft criteria and a process for selecting co-leads for the Steering Committee
- Will meet one more time to compile and integrate information from tonight and choose Steering Committee members


Direct the process of discussing and developing a monitoring plan

- Professional & impartial facilitation
- Quorum:
 - Majority (51%) of active voting members are present; and
 - OAt least a majority (51%) of those present represent people who live in the Richmond-San Pablo area.
- In the event of an impasse, the co-leads and the Air District will be **final decision-makers**
