The Community Steering Committee (CSC) will discuss the intent of CERP Chapter 2 'CSC Members' and Chapter 3 'Vision and Principles' and the timeline for drafting these chapters. The co-chairs will also ask for volunteer(s) to draft Chapters 2 and 3 with support from Air District staff as needed.

6. Consider Recommending to the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD), Community, Equity Health and Justice (CEHJ) Committee that the CEHJ Committee Recommend to the Board of Directors that the Board Dissolve the Community Steering Committee Appointed by Resolution No. 2021-02 to Allow for the Creation of a New, Non-Board-Appointed Steering Committee with a Community-Led Governance Structure

The Community Steering Committee (CSC) will receive a presentation from a member of the governance ad hoc, and will consider recommending to the BAAQMD Community, Equity Health and Justice (CEHJ) Committee that the CEHJ Committee recommend to the Board of Directors that the Board dissolve the CSC appointed by Resolution No. 2021-02. Dissolution will allow for the Richmond, North Richmond, and San Pablo communities to set up a new Steering Committee with a community-led governance structure to lead the development of the AB 617 Community Emission Reduction Plan for these communities.
