

- Understand the role of AB 617 and the Steering Committee in developing community-led solutions to redress racial disparities in air pollution exposure.




Redlining and Environmental Injustice



Federal Housing Authority Policy of Segregation - 1935

"Natural or artificially established barriers will prove effective in protecting a neighborhood from... infiltration of business and industrial uses, lower class occupancy, and inharmonious racial groups"

FHA Underwriting Manual (August 1, 1935) section 309, section 310



Racial and Environmental Segregation in Richmond

Richmond Neighborhoods were segregated by:


- Railroads, highways, shipyards
- Zoning
- Deed restrictions and Racial Covenants



Richmond, California, 1948. African Americans worked together with whites in a Ford assembly plant but were barred from living in white neighborhoods.



Racial and Environmental Segregation in Richmond



The Beginning of the Environmental Justice Movement

- 1982: the siting of a PCB landfill in Warren County, NC sparks national coordination of local environmental justice advocates
- 1987: United Church of Christ Report "Toxic Waste and Race" (http://uccfiles.com/pdf/ToxicWastes&Race.pdf)
- 1992: President Bill Clinton signs Executive Order 12898: Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations
- 2008: President Obama lists environmental justice as a top priority for the US Environmental Protection Agency
- Apr 9, 2021: President Biden budget proposes \$1.4 billion for environmental justice





Steering Committee Co-chair Selection Voting Process

- Use the Mentameter digital platform to select your top three candidates
- We will narrow from 6 to 3 candidates and vote again.
- If there are any ties, we will have a third round of voting to decide the final two Co-chairs
- After the two Co-chairs are decided we will conduct an up-or-down vote to finalize the selection



Instructions for Voting


 There will be two rounds of voting. To vote, please make sure you use the Mentimeter link or QR code which was sent to you by email.

 Round one will ask you to write-in your name before choosing up to 3 candidates to be co-chair. You must write-in your name for your vote to be counted.



Primary Vote: Round 1

- Enter your name if you received the Mentimeter link to enable you to vote for the Steering Committee Co-chairs.
- To vote, please make sure you use the new mentimeter link or QR code which was sent to you just now by email.
- You will see 6 questions. Please only answer 3 of them by <u>entering your name</u> as a "yes" vote for up to 3 candidates. Do not respond to a question that is not one of your 3 "yes" votes.


Primary Vote: Round 2

- To vote, please make sure you use the new mentimeter link or QR code which was sent to you just now by email.
- You will see 3 questions. Please only answer 2 of them by entering your name as a "yes" vote for up to 2 candidates. Do not respond to a question that is not one of your 2 "yes" votes.
- 3a. Enter your name if you want NAME1 to be one of your 2 selections for Steering Committee Co-Chair
- 3b. Enter your name if you want NAME2 to be one of your 2 selections for Steering Committee Co-Chair
- 3c. Enter your name if you want NAME3 to be one of your 2 selections for Steering Committee Co-Chair


