Organization	Monitoring Type	Pollutants Measured
Groundwork Richmond	Saturation: network of 50 Clarity sensors	PM <sub>2.5</sub> , NO <sub>2</sub>
PSE/APEN	Saturation: network of 50+ Aeroqual sensors	50 monitors for PM <sub>2.5</sub> , NO <sub>2</sub> , O <sub>3</sub> 5-10 monitors for PM <sub>2.5</sub> , VOC, CO
Aclima	Mobile: block-by-block screening	PM <sub>2.5</sub> , NO <sub>2</sub> , O <sub>3</sub> , CO, CO <sub>2</sub>




#### What's Next?



## Why have focus areas?

 The initial study area is large and includes many distinct neighborhoods and pollution sources






#### **Discussion of Focus Areas**

Focus areas are based on input from the
 Steering Committee, encompassing areas
 around the pollution sources of concern

 The focus areas shown are a starting point for discussion of potential monitoring studies that may complement the screening projects – so they may change





## **Initial Screening**

Together, the three initial screening projects will provide data to help:


- Provide real-time data to the public
- Identify areas with elevated levels of air pollution
- Measure exposure of PM2.5 and other
   pollutants where vulnerable people spend time
- Compare levels of air pollution in different communities





#### **Discussion of Focus Areas**

- We will discuss three focus areas today,
   followed by three more at the August 14<sup>th</sup>
   meeting
- We will prioritize areas for additional monitoring after all areas have been discussed
- Screening monitoring will be ongoing throughout the entire study area






#### **World Café Format**

## **SC** Deliberation

35 Steering Committee Members

#### Quorum:

- Majority (51% or 18 members) of active voting members are present; and
- A majority (51%) of those present represent people who live in the Richmond-San Pablo area.

#### **Deliberation Process**

Is 51% (18 Committee members) of the Steering Committee in attendance?



Are 51% of Committee members in attendance designated as representatives of Richmond - San Pablo residents?

No, there is NOT a quorum; votes will NOT be held.



No, there is NOT a quorum; votes will NOT be held.

Yes, there IS a quorum; votes may be held.

## **General Votes: Simple Majority**

- For all votes except charter amendments, the **majority** vote determines the outcome (51% or more)
- Members who abstain from voting will NOT be counted as part of the total number of votes.
- In a tie, the final decision will be made by the Co-Lead Team.
  - Co-Lead Team members will discuss and take a separate vote to determine the outcome, and report back to the Steering Committee.
