






Monitoring Process Path Forward



Recap from June SC Meeting

- The Steering Committee considered proposal for a new team to help with communicating updates on monitoring projects after the Steering Committee stops meeting
- Discussions highlighted a need for more clarity on the roles,
 criteria, and commitment for this proposed team



- To better reflect the team's purpose, the team is renamed the Monitoring Outreach Team
- This team is focused on communication and outreach, and will:
 - Work with the Air District in reviewing and revising updates on monitoring projects
 - As needed or desired, present updates at public meeting

- This team is **not** a decision-making body for redirecting or starting new monitoring efforts
- This team is **not** doing work of the CERP Steering Committee,
 like selecting or prioritizing emissions reduction strategies
 - The monitoring project updates, reports, and datasets will be provided to the CERP SC to inform the CERP SC's decisions



Membership and Process

- Team will include up to five members of the Monitoring Plan
 Steering Committee who represent community
- Co-Lead Team recommends that the Monitoring Outreach
 Team be representative of Richmond-San Pablo diversity and geography



Membership and Process

- The Steering Committee received a survey on July 13 to indicate interest in joining the Monitoring Outreach Team
- **Five members** who represent community on the Steering Committee expressed interest in joining:
 - o Dr. Henry Clark
 - Oscar Garcia
 - Matt Holmes
 - Dr. Julia Walsh
 - Linda Whitmore



Membership and Process

Suggested Protocol

- The Co-Lead Team recommends that the Steering Committee votes to approve the five MOT candidates as a group.
- The Charter requires a 51% majority for approval



Monitoring Outreach Team (MOT)

Membership and Process

Suggested Protocol

- If the Steering Committee does not approve the MOT candidates as a group, the Committee will vote on the candidates as individuals. Candidates must receive 51% approval to join the MOT.
- Only members of the Steering Committee can vote on the MOT using the Zoom poll.






