

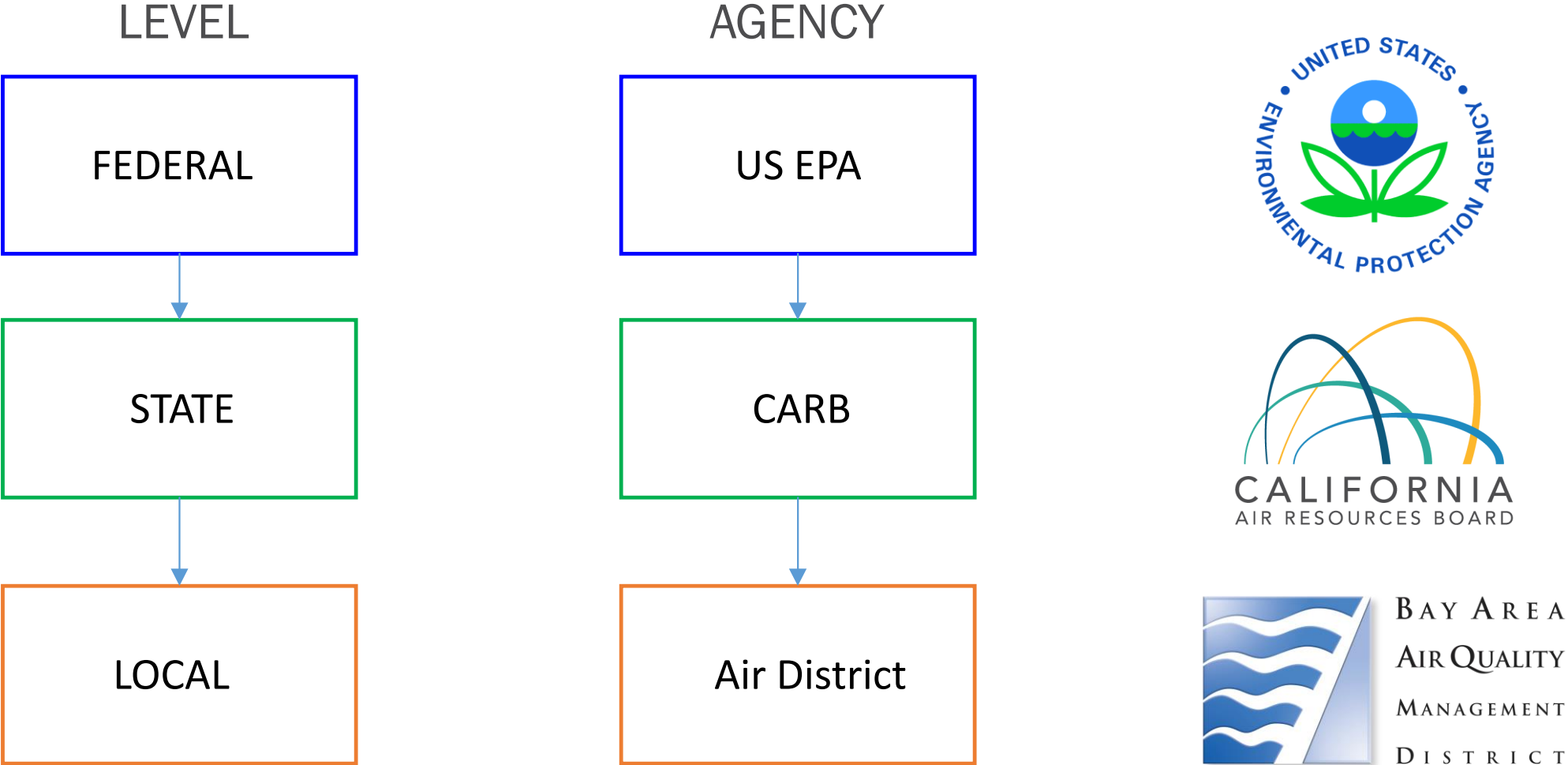

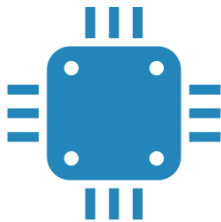

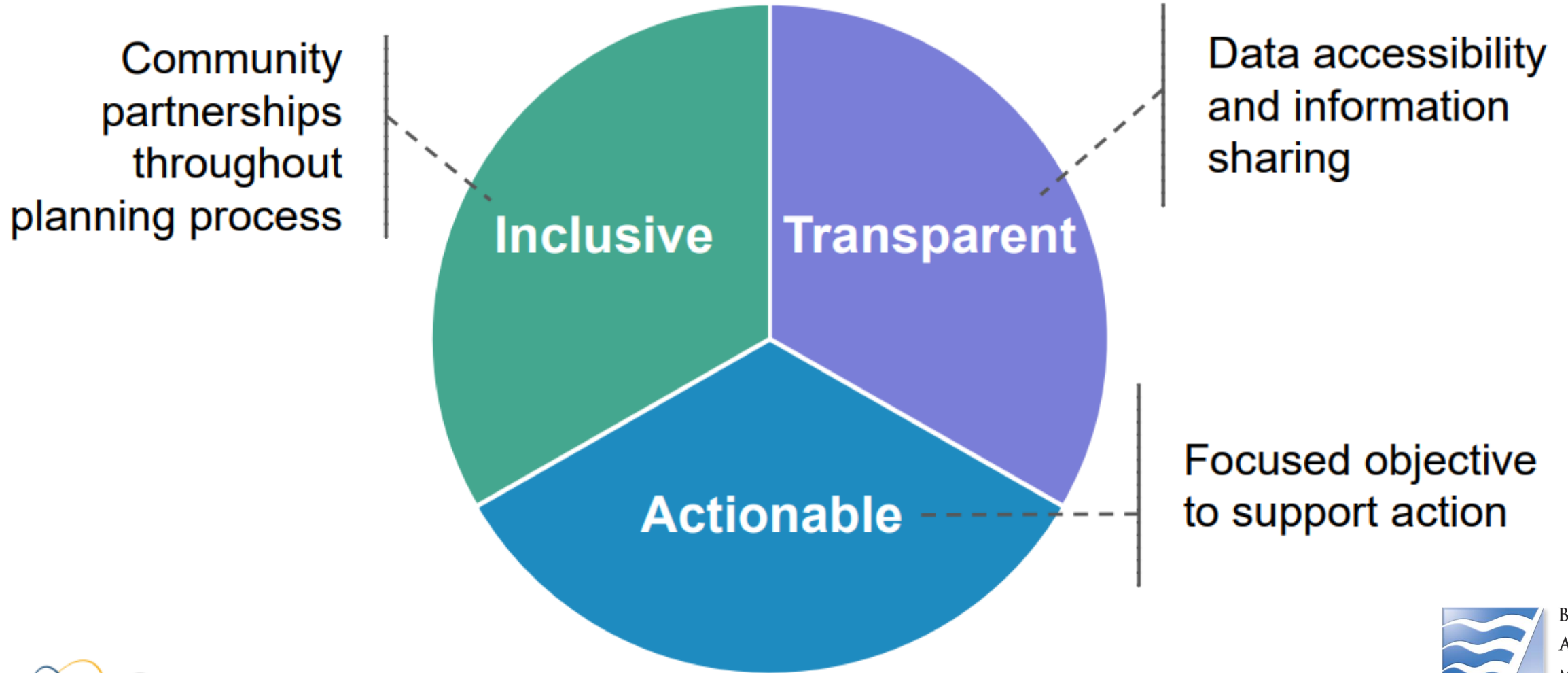
West Oakland Action Plan Steering Committee Meeting 2018

Ten initial communities serve as statewide models

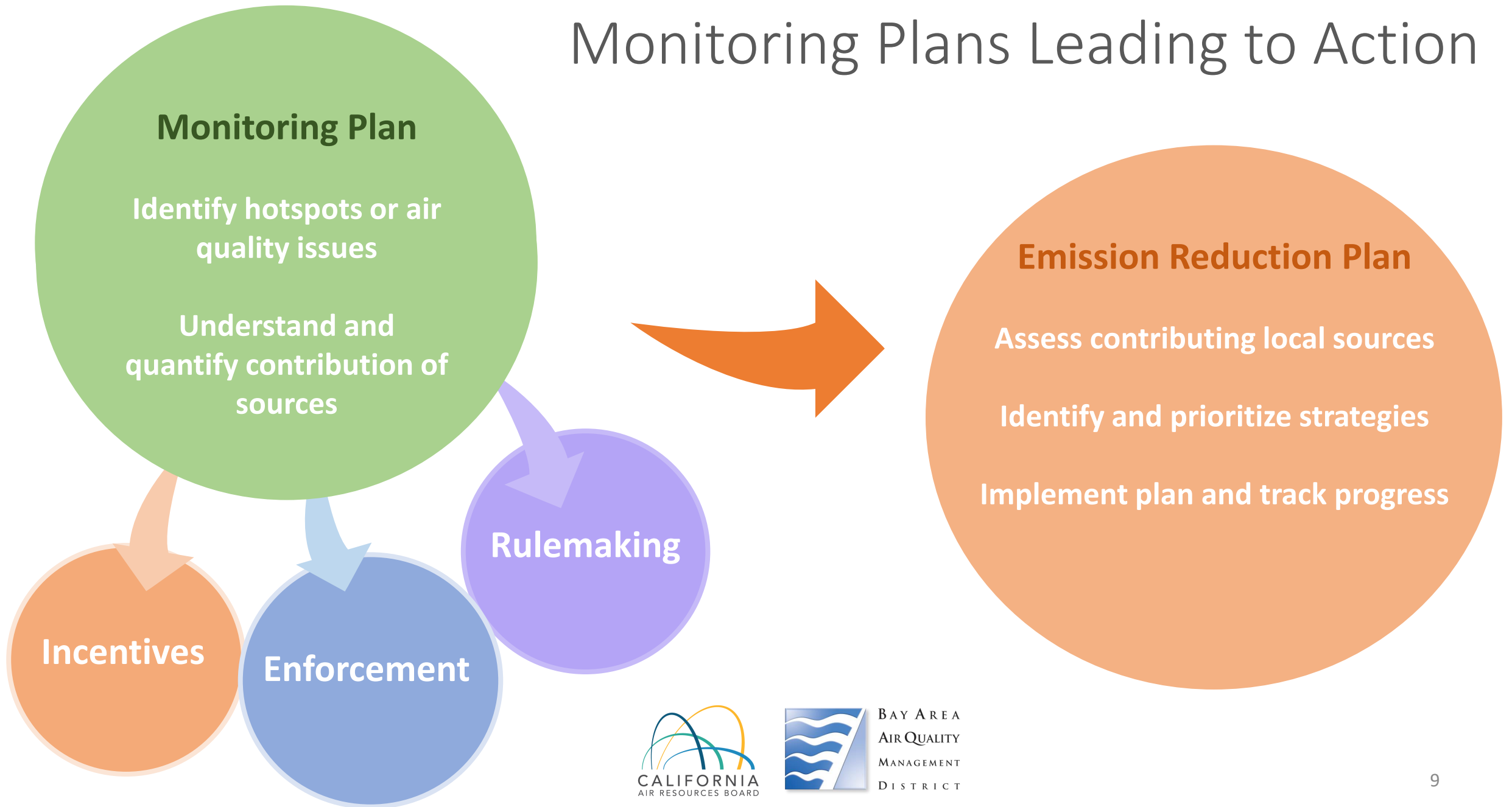

Monitoring plan designed around the community-specific purpose



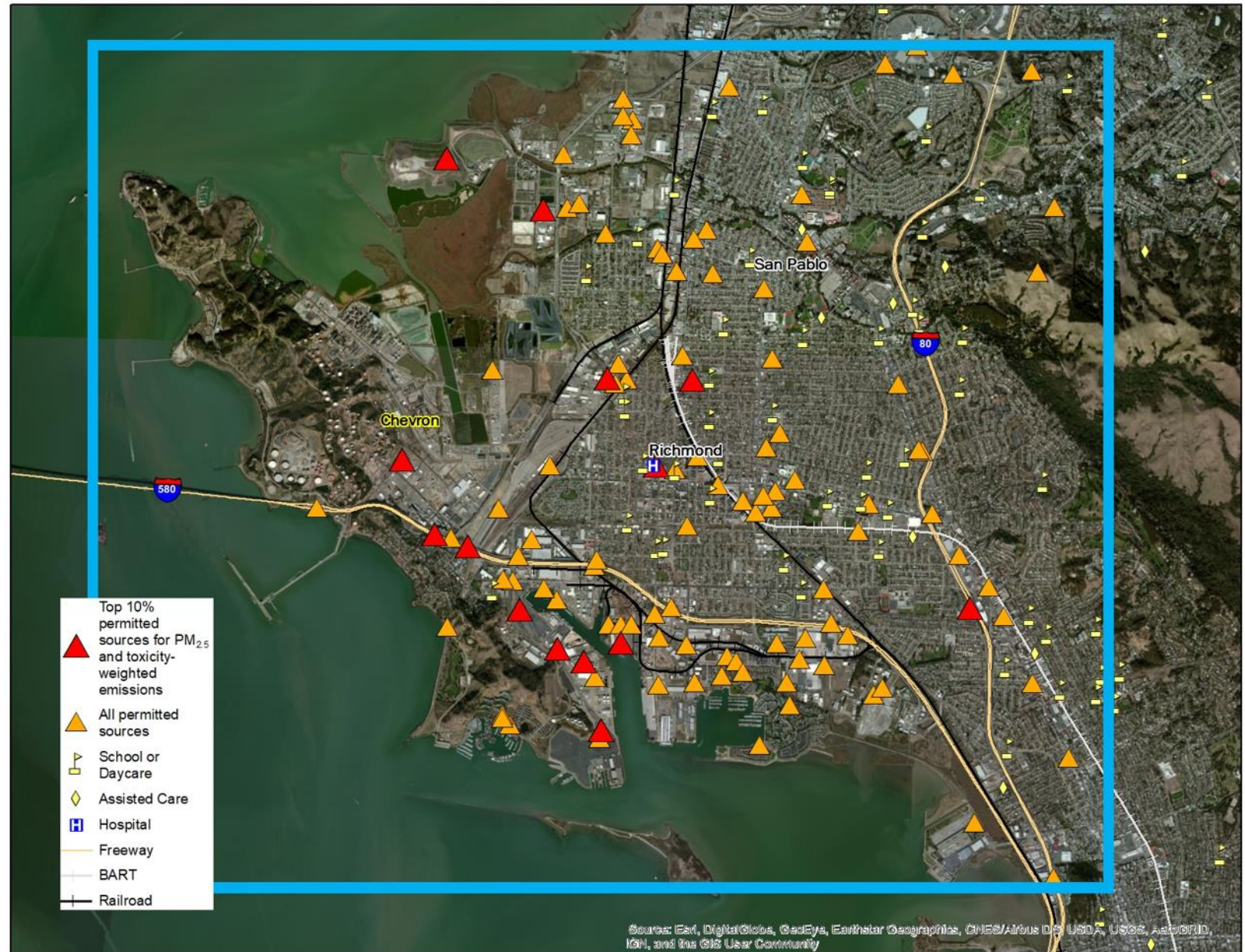
Screening identifies issues over larger areas

Special studies refine information

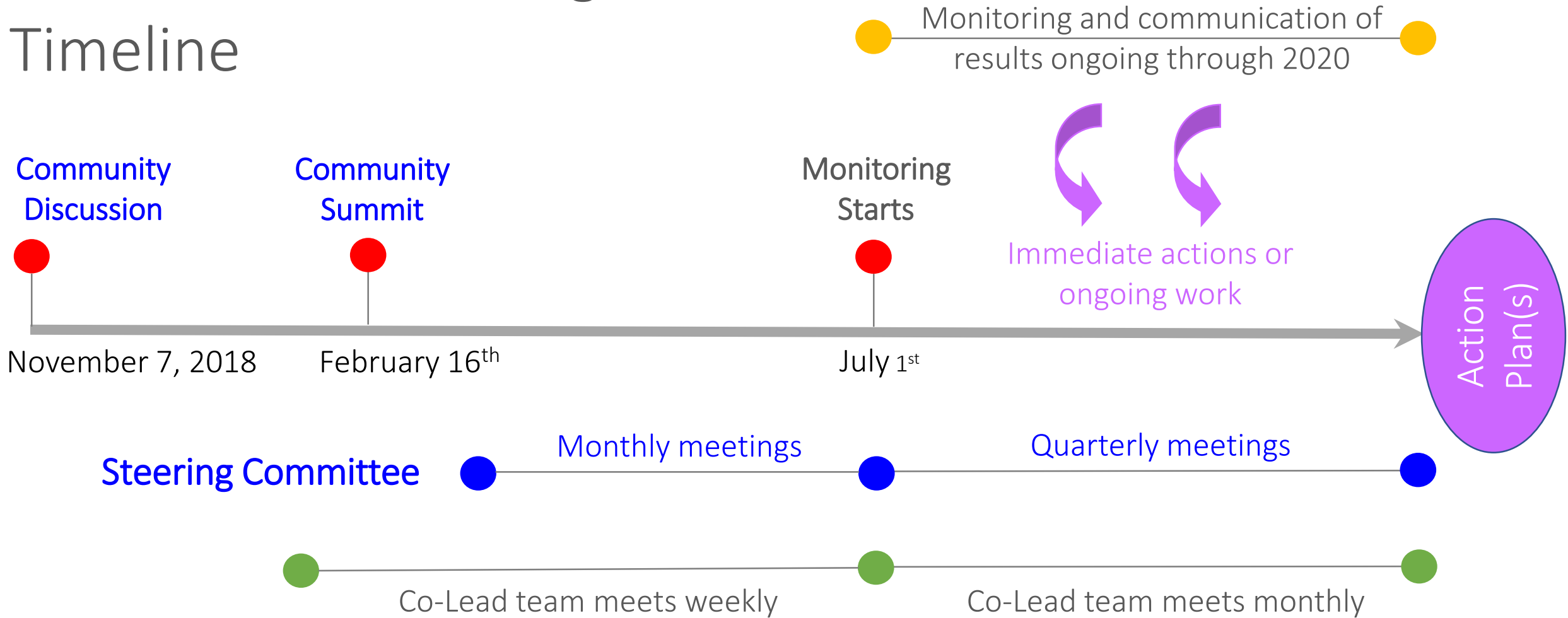
Traditional methods as anchors

COMMUNITY-LED MONITORING FRAMEWORK

CARRY SUCCESS FORWARD

Let's carry Design Team's success into the Steering Committee process. Ensure an inclusive, transparent process with shared goals, thereby creating a greater impact.



BUILT BY COMMUNITY

Process is community-developed, to build trusting relationships and authentic participation.

DEVELOP CHARTER

Focus on Steering Committee membership and decision-making process within the draft charter.



DESIGN TEAM MADE IT HAPPEN

Team designed summit to shape the co-led steering committee process and to ensure committee meets community needs.



COMMUNITY SUMMIT DESIGN TEAM

- 11 individuals from community-based organizations, community groups, and **residents**
- Designed and implemented the Saturday, February 16th summit
- Developed draft criteria, balance and **membership of the Steering Committee** & its decision-making framework
- Developed draft criteria and a process for **selecting co-leads** for the Steering Committee
- Will meet one more time to compile and integrate information from tonight and **choose Steering Committee members**

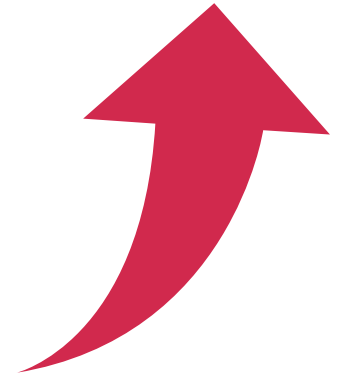
Direct the process of **discussing and developing** a monitoring plan

- Professional & impartial **facilitation**
- Quorum:
 - Majority (51%) of **active voting members** are present; and
 - At least a majority (51%) of those present **represent people who live** in the Richmond-San Pablo area.
- In the event of an impasse, the co-leads and the Air District will be **final decision-makers**
