On May 1, 2024, the Air District Board of Directors approved the Path to Clean Air Plan. On November 7, 2024, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) approved the Path to Clean Air Plan. The Plan is now in the implementation phase. The CSC is recruiting new members who are knowledgeable and passionate about working on the PTCA Plan's implementation phase.

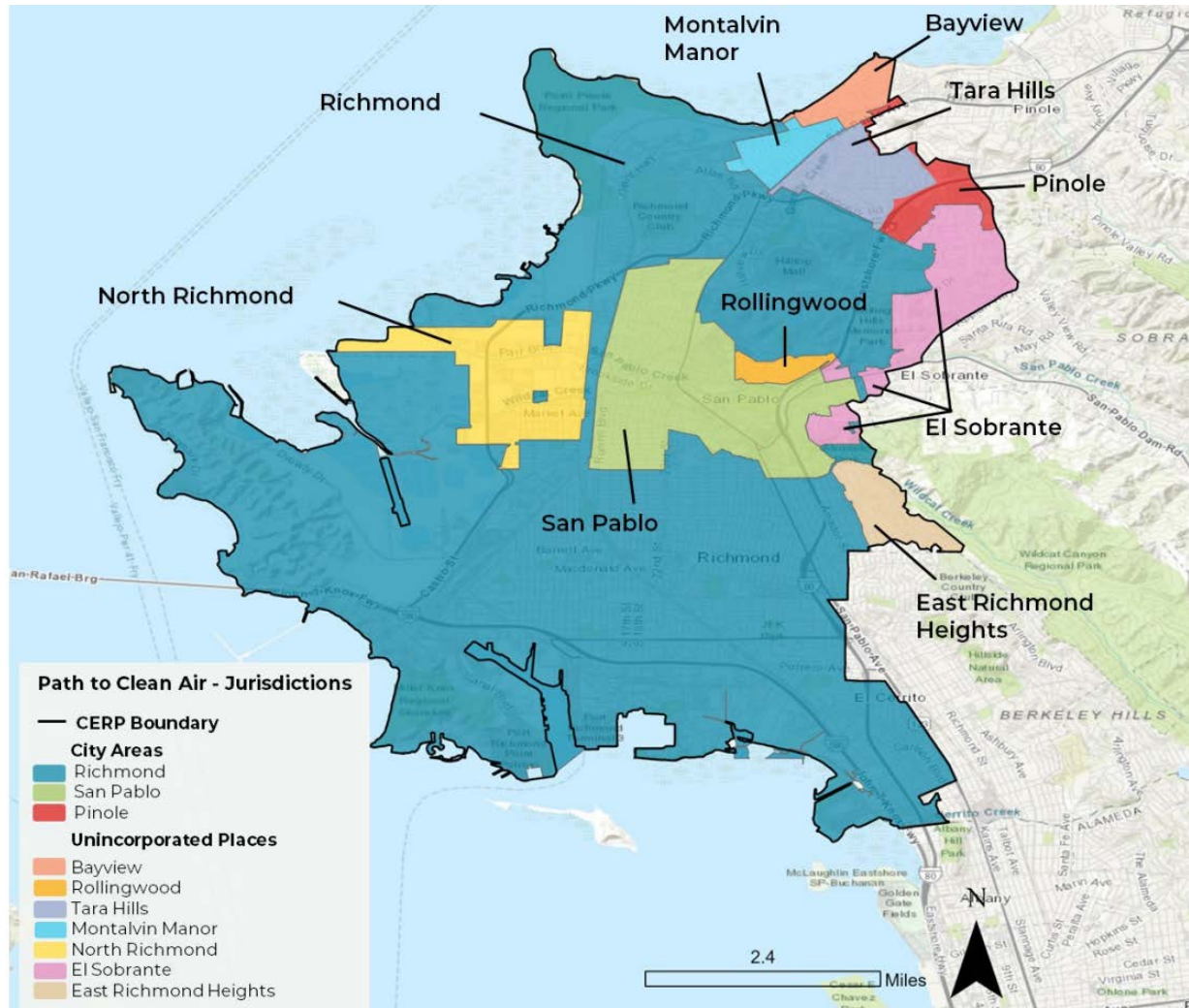
