Background

Since 1992, funding from \$4 surcharge on Bay Area motor vehicles for projects that reduce on-road vehicle emissions

- 60% of TFCA funds awarded directly by the Air District:
 - Air District led projects and programs (Spare the Air, Enhanced Mobile Source)
 - TFCA Regional Fund Program (competitive program)
- Remaining 40% is distributed to the 9-Bay Area Congestion Management Agencies (County Program Manager Fund)
- Each year the Air District's Board of Directors adopts policies and evaluation criteria for TFCA



Background (Cont.)

11/6/13 – Air District Board of Directors:

- Approved TFCA FYE 2014 Regional Fund policies and evaluation criteria
- Allocated up to \$4 million for FYE 2014 Shuttle/Feeder Bus and Ridesharing Projects

11/20/13 – Call for projects opened

12/4/13 & 12/10/13 – Grant application workshops held:

- San Francisco and Online webinar (12/4)
- Oakland (12/10)

12/30/13 –14 applications received by submittal deadline



Policies and Evaluation Criteria for FYE 2014 TFCA Regional Fund

Project-specific Policies:

- Shuttle/feeder bus projects must do the following:
 - Provide connections only between mass transit hubs and distinct commercial or employment areas
 - Not replace or duplicate existing local transit service or service that ceased to operate within the past five years (projects funded in FYE 2013 are exempt from this requirement in FYE 2014)
 - ➤ Include only commuter peak-hour service
 - ➤ Comply with Board approved cost-effectiveness criteria:
 - > Existing shuttle and ridesharing projects CE = \$90,000
 - > Pilot shuttle projects CE = \$125,000 and \$500,000 for projects in CARE areas
- Ridesharing projects must be comprised of riders from a minimum of 5
 Bay Area counties



Project Evaluation Results

10 projects recommended for award:

- 7 projects eligible for award at requested amount (\$3,521,518)
- 3 projects eligible for a reduced award amount (\$210,520)

Total emissions reduced: 66 tons criteria pollutants, 33048 tons CO₂

4 projects not recommended for funding:

- Not cost-effective at any dollar amount
- Duplicates local transit service
- Incomplete application/insufficient information provided






Background

- Calendar Year 2013 \$90 million allocated to reduce emissions from mobile sources:
 - ➤ Air District's primary grant programs:
 - Carl Moyer Program (CMP)
 - Mobile Source Incentive Fund (MSIF)
 - Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)
 - California Goods Movement Bond (I-Bond)
 - ➤ \$8 million to Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA) County Program Managers
 - Federal grants for port trucks, and alternative fuels projects




2013 Allocations: \$90 M






2013 I-Bond Allocations: \$16 M






2013 MSIF Allocations: \$25.2 M






2013 CMP Allocations Years 14 and 15: \$19 M






2013 TFCA Allocations: \$21 M

Emissions Reductions


Emissions reduced by \$45 million in 2013 allocations:

- Particulate Matter (PM) 21 tons per year
- Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) 336 tons per year
- Reactive Organic Gases (ROG) 41 tons per year
- Greenhouse Gases* − 33,367 tons per year

^{*}Not all programs report GHG reductions




2014 Projection: \$58 M

On-road Truck Regulation

- In December 2008 ARB approved the Truck & Bus Regulation
- Applies to all diesel trucks > 14,000 lbs
- Over 35,000 on-road trucks in the Bay Area over 26,000 lbs

On-road Truck Regulation

• ARB Regulatory changes – 11/11/13 Advisory

- Allows truckers (of any size fleet) that make a **good faith effort** to comply with the regulation's 1/1/14 deadline to operate their truck(s) without being subject to enforcement action until 7/1/14.
- ➤ Good faith efforts/trucker actions:
 - o Entered into an agreement with a retrofit installer on, or before 1/1/14
 - Signed a purchase contract and ordered a replacement truck equipped with a PM filter (2007 model year engine or newer)
 - Were approved or denied a loan or other financing for a retrofit PM filter or for a replacement truck equipped with a PM filter
 - O Small fleets that meet the requirements of the Proposition 1B Goods Movement Program, apply for grant funding through by the 12/12/13 deadline, and report into TRUCRS



GMP Year 4

Goods Movement Program Year 4 funding cycle

- \triangleright Application period 8/26/13 12/12/13
- > \$14.5 million available for truck projects (~360 trucks)
- ➤ Up to \$50k for truck replacement projects
- Prioritized funding for small fleets
- > Trucks must be on the road by the end of 2014

Year 4 projects

- ➤ Over \$31 million in applications (~800 trucks)
- ➤ About 50% of the applications were from small fleets
- Existing funds do not match the program demand



Proposed Actions

- Amend Policy #21 of FYE2014 TFCA Regional Fund Policies to allow funding of truck replacements (Attachment 1)
 - ➤ Draft changes sent for public comment on 1/24/2014 no comments received
- Allocate \$5 million in TFCA Regional Funds for truck replacement projects
 - ➤ Replace ~125 trucks
 - Limited to Bay Area registered trucks
 - Must have submitted an application as part of the Year 4 I-Bond solicitation and meet the Program requirements



Next Steps

- Continue GMP Yr 4 implementation
- Work with ARB on rule revisions
- Seek additional GMP funding
- Outreach to Bay Area truckers



Recommendations

Request the Committee recommend the Board of Directors:

- 1. Approve the changes to the FYE 2014 Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA) Regional Fund Policies to include on-road truck replacement projects as an eligible project type.
- 2. Allocate \$5 million in TFCA Regional Funds for eligible projects submitted as part of the Year 4 Goods Movement Program.
- 3. Authorize the Executive Officer/APCO to enter into all contracts for eligible projects.
