


BAY AREA AIR QUALITY CONCERNS

- Climate Pollutants (e.g. GHG)




OZONE EXCEEDANCE TRENDS 1968 TO PRESENT






AIR TOXICS TRENDS 1990 - 2001 - 2014






PM_{2.5} EXCEEDANCE TRENDS 2000 to Present

Hourly PM_{2.5} Readings 2nd Friday in December




WINTER SPARE THE AIR PM_{2.5} REDUCTIONS

- Survey results indicate daily household burning decreased by 50% and # of frequent burners also reduced by 50%
- ¹⁴C analysis indicates compliance with WSTA alerts is 30% to 50%
- Speciation analysis indicates wintertime wood burning has decreased by 40% overall

FINANCIAL SUMMARY RECENT HISTORY

Fiscal Status

- Multi-Year Effort Restored Reserves
- Personnel Costs were Reduced With Attrition
- Fees Increased, but Still Below Costs
- Retirement Medical Liability 40% Funded



FINANCIAL SUMMARY TOPICS FOR FYE 2016 BUDGET

- Hiring Remains a Priority

PURCHASE OF 375 BEALE STREET

- Air District entered into Lease/Purchase Agreement with BAHA for approximately 75,000 square feet at \$385/sq ft.
- Air District Financing completed November 2013
- Purchase Occurs upon Move-In
- MTC, the Air District and ABAG will co-habit under terms of a Condominium Agreement

SB 1415 H&SC AMENDMENTS

- SB 1415 amends the Health and Safety Code as of July 1, 2015
- Abolishes the current membership of the council, and reconstitutes the membership of the council to include 7 appointed members
- Requires the members to be skilled and experienced in the fields of air pollution, climate change, or the health impacts of air pollution and to include a diversity of perspectives, expertise, and backgrounds.
- Advisory Council members continue to serve a term of 2 years.



ADVISORY COUNCIL RESTRUCTURE

- Seven Advisory Council Members
 - Capable of Broad Perspectives
 - Understand the District's Role
 - Oversee Convened Meetings of Subject Matter Experts
- Subject Matter Experts (approximately 25)
 - Drawn from academia and industry
 - Pre-screened for interest and availability
- Staff Lead
 - Arrange Meetings
 - Support Advisory Council Members

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

- 1) Framing of offices, conference rooms and the installation of utilities and plumbing work started in July, 2014 on the 6th floor, has begun on 7th floor
 - Suspension Stairs on Levels 6 8, have been installed
 - Atrium glass installed on Levels 6 & 7
 - Concrete poured for Board Room Seating/Dias
- 2) Target Move Date to 375 Beale is December, 2015(Contingent Upon Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) move-out in February, 2015)
- 3) Construction Schedule Revised to Account for DEA Relocation Delays
 - Tenant Move-out February 1, 2015
 - Agency Move-in December, 2015



FURNITURE PROCUREMENT UPDATE

- 1) Approved Furniture Mock-Ups Re-installed
 - Offices on 6th floor and Workstations on 4th Floor
- 2) Assignment of employee offices and workstations, and the selection of employee office and workstation furniture has been completed
 - Will review budget estimates on furniture selections from all agencies in February, 2015
- 3) Next Steps:
 - Selection of Furniture Finishes- Preliminary review of fabric/finishes/paint options for offices and workstations
 - Review options for Task Chair Sit Test Preliminary review of options of chairs for office/workstations including: task, executive office seating, board member/dias and conference room
 - Review of Executive Office Configurations with agencies



MOVE COORDINATOR UPDATE

- 1) Relocation Connection Inc., selected as the move coordinator vendor in November, 2014
 - Agency representatives project team began meeting with Relocation Connection, in early December
 - Bi-monthly meetings began on Tuesday, January 6, 2015
- Draft Timeline and move activities prepared with December,
 2015 move-in date
 - Incorporates construction schedules and will also include furniture, IT, and new building fit-up with the move activities
- 3) Vendor Coordination Meetings to begin January 23, 2015



INTERNAL MOVE STRATEGY

- 1) Development of a Internal Move Process Underway -
 - Records Management
 - Review of Retention Policies/Procedures
 - Paper Reduction
 - Outside Storage Retained (Richmond)
 - Arrange for Shredding Bins, Purging Bins
- 2) Reviewing Operational Impacts prior to, during and after move:
 - Minimize Disruption;
 - Orderly transition to 375 Beale Street
- Issuance of Request for Proposal for Disposition of Office Furniture Underway
- 4) Issuance of Request for Proposal for Hazardous Material/Waste Disposal
