Overview of Incentive Program



- \$3M Air District funding for cleaner, efficient heating devices
- Assistance for up to 1,300 households
- Incentive Program Design
 - Baseline Funding
 - Enhanced Funding
- Potential for future additional State funding

Incentive Program Funding

\$3 Million Air District Funding

- Device Type Allocation (60%)
 - Heat Pump
 - Natural Gas/ Propane Device
 - EPA Certified Wood-burning Device
- Enhanced Funding Allocation (27%)
 - Low-Income Household
 - Sole Source of Heat Household
 - High Wood Smoke Impacted Area
- Program Administration (13%)

Incentive Program Funding Categories

Enhanced Funding for Selected Groups

Exempt Household High Wood Smoke Area

Note: The maximum amount allowed per household is \$12,000.

Program Administration
