

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District has declared the first Spare the Air day of the season, meaning no wood burning inside or outdoors for at least 24 hours, from midnight Saturday to midnight Sunday.



Results

- 23% of Bay Area households reduced their wood burning
- 69% said there are negative health effects associated with wood smoke
- 51% heard, read or saw media stories about the Winter Spare the Air program this winter
- Support for the Wood Burning Rule remains
 strong and consistent over the past three seasons

 1 non-functional heater




- Complaints: 1,302

Enforcement Practices

- Complaint information is used to determine patrols and to concentrate enforcement on locations with multiple complaints
- Patrol deployment varied throughout the season
- Violations are documented and issued when discovered
