CMP, MSIF, & TFCA

Carl Moyer Program (CMP)

- Created in 1998 to reduce emissions from heavy-duty engines
- Voluntary program that funds surplus emission reductions

Mobile Source Incentive Fund (MSIF)

- ➤ AB 923 allowed for additional \$2 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge (12/04)
- CMP and Lower Emission School Bus Program (LESBP) projects eligible for MSIF funding

Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)

- Funding provided by a \$4 surcharge on motor vehicles
- Statutory authority for the TFCA and requirements of the program are set forth in California Health and Safety Code Sections 44241 and 44242



Greenhouse Gas Reduction Grant Program (GGRGP)

- Settlement agreement between CA Attorney General (AG) and ConocoPhillips (Conoco) in 2007 authorized District to administer a Carbon Offset Fund which provided funding for GGRGP
- Projects must be located in close proximity to Conoco and achieve verifiable, quantifiable reductions in greenhouse gas emissions:
 - Fiscal Year Ending (FYE) 2009: Renewable power & energy efficiency improvements at public buildings (completed by 2015)
 - FYE 2016: Commercial lawn and garden (L&G) equipment exchange program



CMP Year 18

On 3/16/16 District Board of Directors:

- Approved participation in CMP Year 18
- Authorized Executive Officer/APCO to execute contracts and amendments with grant awards up to \$100,000

CMP Project Recommendations over \$100k:

- No Projects for proposed individual grant award over \$100,000
- Projects with individual grant award up to \$100,000 are listed in Attachment 2 of staff report
- CMP Year 18 funds have been expended



FYE 2017 TFCA Funds

District Board of Directors

- 3/16/16 Allocated \$21.7 million and authorized Executive Officer/APCO to execute contracts and amendments with grant awards up to \$100,000
- > 7/20/16 Adopted policies and evaluation criteria

Proposed total awards for 11 projects: \$2,960,547

- Including \$99,900 from the California Energy Commission (CEC)
- Emissions reductions:
 - ~2.21 tons per year (TPY) of criteria pollutants
 - ~2,102 TPY of GHG emissions



TFCA Project Recommendations over \$100k

4 projects to install electric vehicle charging stations:

- 182 single-port Level 2 and 8 DC Fast charging stations in Los Altos, Mountain View and Los Altos Hills
- 52 single-port Level 2 charging stations in San Jose
- 26 single-port Level 2 and 1 DC Fast charging stations in Los Altos
- 20 single-port Level 2 charging stations with solar in Cotati


7 projects to install bike facilities:

- 0.31 miles of Class II & 10.48 miles Class III bikeways in Daly City
- 1.87 miles of Class II bikeways in Santa Rosa
- 1.7 miles of Class II & 7.95 miles of Class III bikeways in San Leandro
- 0.8 miles of Class I bikeway in Albany
- > 7.76 miles of Class III and .7 miles of Class IV bikeways in Cupertino
- 0.28 miles of Class I bikeway in San Carlos
- 104 electronic bicycle lockers in San Jose



GGRGP Commercial L&G Program

District Board of Directors on 2/17/16

- Allocated \$517,270; and
- Authorized Executive Director/APCO to execute contracts and amendments with grant awards up to \$100,000

GGRGP L&G Project Recommendations over \$100K:

- 2 projects to replace conventional equipment with zero-emission equipment including:
 - Replace 41 pieces of equipment in Berkeley
 - Replace 20 pieces of equipment in Oakland
- Proposed total award of \$226,932
- Emissions reductions:
 - ~1.33 TPY of criteria pollutants
 - ~194 TPY of GHG emissions

Background

District Financial Audit:

- Government agencies are required by law to conduct an independent audit of their annual financial statements
- Compliance Audit for Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA):
 - California Health and Safety Code Section 44242 requires an audit on each program or project funded with motor vehicle registration fee surcharges (TFCA) at least every two years
- District's administrative code requires audit contracts to be rebid every three years

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Scope of Work

Project #1: Financial Audit

Conduct Air District's Annual Financial Audit for fiscal year ending (FYE) 2018 (General Fund and Special Revenue Fund)

Project #2: TFCA Compliance Audit

- Conduct a Compliance Audit of TFCA projects and programs closed by 6/30/2017
 - Regional Fund projects & programs audited annually
 - County Program Manager Program audited every other year

For Regional Fund:

70 projects x \$943 per project + \$6,000 summary reports = \$72,000

For County Program Manager (year 2 only): 120 projects x \$250 per project + \$2,000 summary reports = \$32,000



Recommendations

Recommend the Board of Directors:

- Approve the selection of Simpson & Simpson, LLP to conduct a Financial Audit for FYE 2018 and a Compliance Audit of the Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA) programs and projects that closed by FYE 2017;
- Authorize the Executive Officer/APCO to execute a contract with Simpson & Simpson, LLP at a cost not to exceed \$119,350 for services performed in FYE 2018 (Year 1); and
- Authorize the Executive Officer/APCO to extend the contract with Simpson & Simpson, LLP in an amount not to exceed \$151,350 annually for up to two additional years, at the Air District's discretion, based on contractor's performance.

Background – EPA Funding

- Diesel Emission Reduction Act (DERA) of 2005 authorizes EPA funding to reduce diesel emissions
- April 18, 2017, EPA Office of Transportation & Air Quality opens Request for Proposals through Clean Diesel Funding Assistance Program (CDFAP)
- Funding targets projects that:
 - Achieve significant emission reductions from diesel engines
 - Reduce diesel emissions exposure
 - Operate goods movement in areas with poor air quality





Background – Port of Oakland

- 6th Largest Container Port in US:
 - 18 Berths, 36 Container Cranes, 6,500 Trucks, 2 Rail yards
 - Located adjacent to West Oakland community
- District actions to reduce DPM:
 - Planning
 - Monitoring
 - Enforcement
 - Direct Incentives **>\$80M** for trucks, shore power, harbor craft, etc.)







Proposed Project

June 23, 2017: District submitted proposal to EPA to replace one uncontrolled, high polluting, switcher locomotive with a low emission Tier 4 locomotive


 Owned by Oakland Global Rail Enterprise, LLC.

Expected in-service in 2019

 Total Project Cost: \$2,571,462

Estimated lifetime emission reductions:

- 118 tons NOx
- 6 tons Hydrocarbons
- 2.6 tons of PM





EPA Award

- July 26, 2017, EPA informed District of proposed \$639,670 award
 - Total project cost = \$2,571,462
 - Matching funds = \$1,931,792
 - Award includes \$14,670 for Air District administration
- Acceptance of funds requires adoption of Board resolution



September 28, 2017 FUNDING FROM U.S. EPA



Recommendations

Recommend the Board of Directors:

- Adopt a Resolution authorizing the Air District to accept, oblige, and expend up to \$639,670 in funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to replace one locomotive; and
- Authorize the Executive Officer/APCO to enter into all agreements necessary to accept and expend this funding.
