NEW AND ENHANCED PROGRAMS Resulting General Fund Expenses

Representative values – to be updated with March Draft Budget

Increases in FYE 2019 budget compared to FYE 2018

- \$6 M / Year Personnel
- \$1 M / Year Equipment
- \$1 M / Year Data Analysis



- The current Cost Recovery policy is sufficient to fund the new and enhanced programs
- If State funding for AB 617 does not persist, other actions may be necessary:



CALPERS PENSION

CALPERS DISCRETIONARY FUNDING Current Status

- **\$283 M Obligation**: 73% Funded (\$207 M)
- Funding Policy: 90% Funding Level (\$255 M)
 - ➤ No Target Date
 - > FYE 2018 discretionary funding: \$1 M

CALPERS DISCRETIONARY FUNDING Recommendation

Policy Recommendation:

- ➤ Establish a 20 Year target to reach 90% funding
- ➤ Use 6.5% discount rate to calculate contribution
- ➤ Achieves 90% funding in FYE 2039
- > Results in FYE 2019 contribution of \$1 M




MEDICAL RETIREMENT (OPEB)

OPEB DISCRETIONARY FUNDING Current Status

- **\$59 M Obligation**: 68% Funded (\$40 M)
- Funding Policy: 90% Funding Level (\$53 M)
 - ➤ No Target Date
 - > FYE 2018 pre-fund: \$4 M

MEDICAL RETIREMENT (OPEB)



OPEB DISCRETIONARY FUNDING Recommendation

- Continue with annual \$4 M prefund
- Allows annual \$4 M to be reallocated to CalPERS required contributions in approximately 3 years





During the season, air district officials issue Winter Spare the Air alerts that make it illegal to burn wood, manufactured fire logs or other solld fuel indoors and outdoors for the uncoming day.

Outreach Results

- Survey results indicate program has high recognition & compliance
- In-language surveys were conducted in Spanish & Chinese
- Support for the wood smoke rule strong at 73%
- 57% heard, read or saw media stories about the Winter Spare the Air program
- 76% think there are negative health effects associated with breathing wood smoke

Winter 2017/2018 Wood Smoke Reduction Incentive Program



\$750 to Decommission



\$1,000 for natural gas device



\$3,500 for electric heat pump

- The Board allocated \$3 Million for this program back in 2016.
- Funded approximately 1300 projects.

Devices replaced:


- 81% Open-hearth fireplace
- 10 % fireplace with wood-burning insert
- 9% Free-standing wood-stove

Replacement project distribution:

- 93% Natural gas
- 4% Electric heat pump
- 3% Decommission

Summary and Next Steps

- Continue Forecasting and Enforcement Program.
- Award a new Spare the Air & Winter Spare the Air campaign contract (3-year contract) which includes:
 - Advertising
 - Media Relations
 - Social Media
 - Employer Program
 - Public Opinion Surveys
- Evaluate the effectiveness of the Wood Smoke Reduction Incentive Program.

AB 617 Status


- Completed Regional Meeting on January 31, 2018

- Beginning West Oakland Action Plan development
- Preliminary work on Richmond Monitoring Campaign
