AB 617 Community-Driven Programs

Community Action Plan

- Identify, prioritize, and implement emission and exposure reduction measures
- Must develop and submit emission reduction plan to California Air Resources Board (CARB) one year after the community is selected by CARB


Community Monitoring Plan

- Better understand sources contributing to disparate air quality impacts
- Initial monitoring required to start on July 1, 2019
- No formal requirement for plan submittal timing or approval



GETTING TO AUTHENTIC PARTICIPATION

- Multiple conversations to encourage participation
- Request for Proposals to find willing community members
- Offered direct assistance to applicants
- No community members responded
- Had to reimagine an entirely different process




Steering Committee Balance



- School/Teacher grant funding










Spare the Air Youth Program

- Deadline to apply is July 12, 2019


