## Carl Moyer Program (CMP)

- Created in 1998 to reduce emissions from heavy-duty engines
- Voluntary program that funds surplus emission reductions

### Mobile Source Incentive Fund (MSIF)

- Assembly Bill (AB) 923 allowed for additional \$2 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge (12/04)
- CMP and Lower Emission School Bus Program (LESBP) projects eligible for MSIF funding



## Community Health Protection Grant Program (CHP)

- Created by AB 134 appropriation of \$250 Million (M) from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF) to reduce mobile source emissions including criteria pollutants, toxic air contaminants, and greenhouse gases in AB 617 communities
- ❖ Bay Area Air Quality Management District (Air District) allocated \$50M of these funds for emission reduction projects under the CMP, and optionally under the Proposition 1B Goods Movement Emission Reduction Program



### CMP/MSIF & CHP

#### ❖ On 2/21/18 Air District Board of Directors:

- Approved participation in CMP Year 20
- Authorized Executive Officer/APCO to execute contracts and amendments with grant awards up to \$100,000

#### ❖ On 12/20/17 Air District Board of Directors:

 Approved acceptance of \$50M in AB 134 funding for the Community Health Protection Grant Program (CHP)



## CMP/MSIF & CHP Project Recommendations Over \$100k

- \$5,330,724 in total awards for eight (8) projects:
  - 18 school buses
  - 6 marine engines
  - 1 locomotive
  - 2 forklifts
- Emission reductions:
  - Over 9.6 tons per year (TPY) of criteria pollutants



## Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)

- Statutory authority set forth in California Health and Safety Code Sections 44241 and 44242
- Funding provided by a \$4 surcharge on motor vehicles:
  - 60% of TFCA funds awarded directly by the Air District (Regional Fund & Air District Sponsored)
  - Remaining 40% is distributed to the nine Bay Area Congestion Management Agencies (County Program Manger Fund)



## Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)

#### ❖ On 5/2/18 Air District Board of Directors:

- Allocated \$20.44M of TFCA funds for Fiscal Year Ending (FYE)
   2019 projects
- Authorized Executive Officer/APCO to execute contracts and amendments with grant awards up to \$100,000

#### On 6/6/18 Air District Board of Directors:

Adopted policies and evaluation criteria for the FYE 2019
 TFCA Regional Fund program



## Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)


- \$2,368,345 in total awards for three pilot trip reduction projects
  - Proposed award based on recommendation to increase cost-effectiveness (C/E) threshold up to \$500,000/ton of reduced criteria pollutants for pilot trip reduction projects (current C/E limit is \$250,000)
  - Staff also recommends a similar change to TFCA County Program Manger policies

#### Emission reductions:

Over 2.7 tons per year (TPY) of criteria pollutants



## Projected Grant Revenues for FYE 2019 \$137 (in Millions)



<sup>\*</sup>Total Volkswagen funding is \$423M statewide, which will be dispersed over ~5 year period. Staff projects that as much as 33% of funding could go to projects located in the Bay Area.




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## Status of Incentive Funding Awarded Since July 2018, by Funding Source

## FYE 2019 TFCA Shuttle & Ridesharing Solicitation

- Solicitation open from August 1, 2018 to September 17, 2018
- Allocated \$4 Million (M) of TFCA funds
- Received nine applications
  - 7 existing shuttle services
  - 2 ridesharing projects (including 1 from MTC)
- Total of \$2M in TFCA funds awarded to six projects as of April 2019



## MTC's 2019 Rideshare Application

- \$1M funds requested for new program; no existing data
- Project aligns with the goals of Air District's Spare the Air Program
- Recommendation: Evaluate project as part of Spare the Air Program vs. using Shuttle Criteria

#### Vanpool Subsidies (\$750k)


- Provide \$350/month to select vanpools
- Maintain and grow the Bay Area vanpool fleet

#### Carpool Marketing & Incentives (\$250k)

- Provide marketing, outreach, & incentives to commuters
- Encourages commuters to download carpool apps and register for 511-ride matching service



Tons of emissions reduced (green) by replacing 50 cars (blue) with 1 bus (red)




#### Notes:

- 2. Used fleet average emission rates for passenger cars, new vehicle emission rates for urban buses from EMFAC2014




## Air Quality Benefits of TFCA-Funded Shuttle & Rideshare Projects






## Cost-Effectiveness Thresholds Over Time

## Other Challenges and Next Steps

#### Other Challenges:

- Competitive annual funding cycle does not allow for long-term planning
- Emission benefits challenging to quantify

#### **Next Steps and Options for Consideration:**

- Keep increasing C-E Thresholds; explore options for other ways to evaluate air quality benefits from trip reduction projects
- Evaluate options for transitioning other existing projects to Spare the Air program
- Seek input from stakeholders and best practices from other air districts
- Return to committee with recommendations on options

## **CPM Program Background**

- Funded by Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)
  - > \$4 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge
    - 40% of TFCA monies for CPM Program
- Statutory authority in California Health & Safety Code Sections 44241 and 44242
  - CPMs submit annual expenditure plan
    - Funds must be allocated within six months of the Board of Director's (Board) approval of expenditure plan
    - Funds not allocated by the deadline will be awarded by the Air District
  - CPM policies & cost-effectiveness criteria adopted by the Board annually (for FYE 2020 on 11/7/18)






# Over \$10 Million (M) Awarded (2016 – 2019)



### **Facility Type for Awarded Projects**




#### **Charger Type for Awarded Projects**



# Geographic Distribution of Charge! Projects (2016 – 2019)




#### **Projects Awarded Per Capita**





### Publicly Accessible Charging Port Locations




### **Funding Sources for Publicly Accessible Charging Ports**

**Expand outreach activities** to raise general awareness of EVs and incentives programs (starting in 2020)



**Provide technical assistance** to businesses and local governments on EVs, EV infrastructure, and incentives (starting in 2020)




Understand majority adopters to move market beyond early adopters

# Recommendation 1 of 2: Center for Sustainable Energy (CSE)





- Nonprofit organization supporting governments to conduct research, develop strategies, implement programs for clean vehicles
- Implementer of the California, Connecticut, Massachusetts, and New York statewide EV incentive programs

### **Proposed research:**

- Builds from previous surveys of low-income communities and dealership
- Mixed approach including surveys, focus groups, and interviews
- Budget: \$115,000

### Recommendation 2 of 2: Kearns and West



- Selected through RFP in 2015 to support Bay Area EV Council
- Current contract ends in June 2019
  - Facilitation and logistics for quarterly meetings
  - Coordinating input from participants to update meeting structure and goals
- Board of Directors (April 3, 2019) approved contract to develop an air quality technical assistance center which increased total contracts with Kearns and West (>\$100,000)

### **Recommended Actions**



### Recommend the Board of Directors:

- 1. Authorize the Executive Officer/APCO to execute a contract with the CSE in an amount not to exceed \$115,000 for EV market research services; and
- 2. Authorize the Executive Officer/APCO to execute a contract with Kearns and West in an amount not to exceed \$36,000 for meeting and stakeholder facilitation for the Bay Area EV Coordinating Council.
