Dr. Clark was asked to give remarks, and he thanked Ladonna Williams, Dr. Raymond Tompkins, and Director Gioia for helping coordinate this document and gesture from the Air District.

consequences on 911 callers who are motivated by an individual's race, religion, sex, or any other protected class by designating such reports as a hate crime.

# 11. Report of the Legislative Committee Meeting of September 30, 2020

Legislative Committee Chair, Margaret Abe-Koga, read the following committee report:

The Committee met on Wednesday, September 30, 2020, and approved the minutes of June 25, 2020. This meeting was conducted under procedures authorized by executive order N-29-20 issued by Governor Gavin Newsom. Members of the committee participated by teleconference.

The Committee reviewed and discussed the staff presentation Recap of 2020 Legislative Year, capturing two Air District-sponsored bills that were not passed by the State, and the status of Assembly Bill 617 funding.

The Committee then reviewed and discussed the staff presentation Federal Legislative Update, which included four federal bills that the Air District is monitoring regarding alternative fueling infrastructure, wildfire smoke, funding for special districts, and clean energy microgrids.

The Committee then reviewed and discussed the staff presentation Consideration of Proposition 16, a constitutional amendment to repeal Proposition 209 (1996), which prohibits the state from discriminating against, or granting preferential treatment to, any individual or group on the basis of race, sex, color, ethnicity, or national origin in the operation of public employment, public education, or public contracting. Proposition 16 is the result of the passage of Assembly Constitutional Amendment 5. The Committee recommends the Board:

1) Adopt a **SUPPORT** position on Proposition 16 (2020) to repeal Section 31 of Article I of the California Constitution.

The Committee then reviewed and discussed the staff presentation Potential 2021 Legislative Activities, regarding topics such as indirect source authority, meeting compensation for Air District Board members, intellectual property authority, amending Assembly Bill 617 or the Community Air Protection program, composition of the Air District Board, and the reauthorization of existing air pollution funding sources whose fund are to expire in 2023.

Finally, the Committee reviewed and discussed the staff presentation Overview of Governor's Executive Order N-79-20, focusing on vehicular emission reduction targets to address climate change.

   the Air District called 46 Spare the Air alerts during the summer season thus far.

- Air quality forecast videos, presented by the Air District's Meteorologists, have gained popularity during the summer into fall, and have even been incorporated into local news stations' broadcasts.
- This warming and fire trend is the new normal and will most likely intensify over time.
