Community Health Protection Program (CHP)

Funding Agricultural
Replacement Measures
for Emission Reductions
(FARMER)

- Created in 1998
- Administered in partnership with California Air Resources Board (CARB)
- Assembly Bill (AB)923 (2004)
- Additional \$2 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge
- AB 617 (2017)
- Funds distributed through the Community Health Protection Program
- Established by CARB in 2018

CMP/MSIF, CHP, and FARMER Project Recommendations over \$100k




- Recommend \$1,435,960 in awards for six projects to replace 10 pieces of diesel-powered:
 - √ agricultural equipment
 - ✓ school buses
 - ✓ off-road construction vehicle
 - √ heavy heavy-duty trucks
- Emissions Reductions
 - ✓ Over 6.33 tons per year (TPY) of criteria pollutants



Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)



- Statutory authority set forth in California Health and Safety Code Sections 44241 and 44242
- Funding provided by a \$4 surcharge on motor vehicles



TFCA Project Recommendations over \$100k




- Recommend award of \$116,000 to one project to:
 - ✓ Purchase four electric delivery vans and scrap six existing vehicles
- Emissions Reductions
 - ✓ Over 0.083 TPY of criteria pollutants



Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)




- TFCA funding authorized by State Legislature to help reduce on-road mobile source emissions
- \$4 motor vehicle registration surcharge fee with 40% of funds distributed to the nine Bay Area congestion management agencies
- Staff brings updates to TFCA CPM policies to Air District Board of Directors annually for approval

- Assembly Bill (AB) 923 (2004)
- Additional \$2 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge

- California Health and Safety Code Sections 44241 and 44242
- Funding provided by a \$4 surcharge on motor vehicle registrations











Charge! Facility Types






Bay Area Electric Vehicle Chargers







Charge! Program Fiscal Year Ending 2021 \$6 Million Proposed



- \$5 Million (M) TFCA
 - Region-wide projects similar to Fiscal Year Ending (FYE) 2019 program
- \$1 M MSIF
 - Add flexibility to reduce the barriers for MUD operators in AB 617 communities
- Projects solicited and selected through a competitive bid process

Recommended Action



Recommend the Board of Directors:

Allocate \$1 Million in Mobile Source Incentive Funds (MSIF) for electric vehicle charging projects at multi-unit dwellings in AB 617 communities.
