#### BACKGROUND

During the September 2, 2021, the Community Equity, Health, and Justice Committee meeting, Air District staff committed to begin training initiatives for all Board of Directors and staff in the fall of 2021 to increase cultural competence and humility, better understand structural racism and social inequities, and help Board members and staff further build community relationships.

These training sessions help provide the learning and training to further formulate and implement Air District policies that are inclusive, constructive, and meaningfully address inequities in air pollution burden across the Bay Area region. The first module focused on the nexus between racial segregation and current environmental and pollution disparities. The Second module discussed the topics of community partnerships and power sharing.

The third module in this training series will build off the first two modules and will explore the importance of understand the sources of conflict and taking proactive steps to anticipate and productively manage conflict when it occurs. The training will focus on practical tips and strategies to help prevent conflict from escalating.

#### DISCUSSION

The training will engage with Board Members to share their experiences and lessons learned on navigating conflict in tense and challenging circumstances.
