Re: Amendments to Regulation 8: Organic Compounds, Rule 18: Equipment Leaks

RECOMMENDED ACTION

None; receive and file.

BACKGROUND

This rule development project would address emissions of Total Organic Compounds (TOC) from petroleum refineries, chemical plants, bulk terminals and bulk plants, and other facilities that store, transport, and use organic liquids. Amendments to Regulation 8, Rule 18: Equipment Leaks (Rule 8-18) in December 2015 addressed equipment that services heavy liquids (liquid with an initial boiling point greater than 302 °F) at these facilities. However, due to questions regarding emissions reductions and cost-effectiveness related to the requirements for monitoring of components in heavy liquid service, Resolution No. 2015-12 directed staff to examine these issues further and recommend modifying this rule if appropriate. In addition, the Air District was sued in January 2016 by three Petroleum Refineries, which resulted in a settlement agreement between the Air District and the Petroleum Refineries issued in March 2017. To determine appropriate emission factors for heavy liquid leaks, a Heavy Liquids Study was conducted and a report detailing this effort was issued in April 2022. Using the findings from this study, the Air District is currently proceeding with rule amendments to limit emissions associated with a subset of equipment that services heavy liquids. These rule amendments include the provisions agreed upon in the settlement agreement.

California Assembly Bill (AB) 617 requires each air district that is in nonattainment for one or more air pollutants to adopt an expedited schedule for implementation of Best Available Retrofit Control Technology (BARCT) by the earliest feasible date, but not later than December 31, 2023. In 2018, the Air District adopted the Expedited BARCT Implementation Schedule, which identified potential rule development projects to evaluate and implement BARCT at industrial sector facilities subject to California Greenhouse Gas Cap-and-Trade Requirements. Due to the uncertainty surrounding the emissions reductions from the 2015 amendments, emissions from equipment leaks were identified as a potential source of substantial reductions and included on the Expedited BARCT Implementation Schedule.

DISCUSSION

Air District Staff evaluated fugitive emissions associated with equipment in heavy liquid service utilizing the emission data from the Heavy Liquids Study. The emissions reductions and compliance costs associated with equipment in heavy liquid service were calculated at various initial boiling points. Based on this analysis, a subset of components in heavy liquid service was added to the Leak Detection and Repair (LDAR) program.

Key points of the draft amendments to Rule 8-18 include:

- Subject a subset of components in heavy liquid service to LDAR program requirements
 - Add valves and pumps handling material with initial boiling point between 302 and 372 °F to the LDAR program
 - o Add components handling material in a gas or vapor phase to the LDAR program
- Make total organic compound component leak standards more stringent
 - o 100 to 50 ppm for valves and connections
 - o 500 to 100 ppm for pumps and compressors
- Add operating requirements and standards for selected components
- Enhance inspection procedures, reporting, and oversight requirements
- Other administrative updates and clarifications
- Additional definitions for clarity and completeness

Air District staff anticipate releasing proposed amendments to Rule 8-18 and a supporting regulatory package for public review and comment in the fourth quarter of 2023 including CEQA documentation and socioeconomic impact analysis as appropriate. Air District staff will solicit comments on these materials and plans to present the proposed amendments to Rule 8-18 for consideration by the Air District Board of Directors at a Public Hearing in the first quarter of 2024.
