Air District grants pave the way for Bay Area electric vehicles

SAN FRANCISCO – The Bay Area Air Quality Management District announced today it will fund 226 electric vehicle charging stations at 48 locations to form a Bay Area-wide infrastructure network for electric vehicles.

The vehicle charging network will remove barriers to using clean electric vehicles throughout the Bay Area.

“As automakers provide more electric vehicle options, it’s important that the infrastructure is in place to support these cleaner transportation options,” said Jack Broadbent, executive officer of the Air District. “We believe Air District grants for charging stations will make electric vehicles a more viable option for many Bay Area residents.”

The charging locations will be strategically located near highways in parking lots and garages and will be available for use by the general public.
