MEDIA ADVISORY: No Spare the Air Smog Alert for July 5

SAN FRANCISCO - Today the Bay Area Air Quality Management District WILL NOT BE issuing a *Spare the Air Health Alert* for Tuesday, July 5.

Onshore winds will continue tomorrow, keeping air pollution in moderate levels across the Bay Area.

Temperatures will remain high on Tuesday, and the Air District encourages residents to drive less and reduce their energy use to prevent pollution.

A list of simple things the public can do to make clean air choices every day:

- Bike to work or around town
- Take public transit
- Work at home or telecommute
- Carpool and link your errands to reduce driving
- Avoid using gas-powered lawn mowers and leaf blowers
- Reduce household energy use
- Use a gas grill instead of charcoal
- Avoid using aerosol spray cleaners, paints and hairspray
