## Limited availability for Air District website this weekend

**SAN FRANCISCO** - Due to a planned local utility outage, Air District websites, phone systems and other electronic services will have limited availability over the weekend of **Friday**, **October 5**, through **Monday**, **October 8**.

The <u>www.baaqmd.gov</u> and <u>www.sparetheair.org</u> websites, agency phones and related electronic services, including widgets and RSS feeds, will go down for a few hours late on the **night of Friday**, **October 5**, with service resuming on the **morning of Saturday**, **October 6**. Service will again be interrupted for a few hours late on the **night of Sunday**, **October 7**, with full service expected to resume on **Monday**, **October 8**.
