## Call for applications for new Spare the Air Leadership Award Air District joins Acterra to recognize air pollution reduction efforts

**SAN FRANCISCO** – The Bay Area Air Quality Management District is announcing its sponsorship of a new award in conjunction with the 2017 Acterra Business Environmental Awards: the Spare the Air Leadership Award.

The award will be given to a specific Bay Area air quality improvement project that has demonstrated significant leadership in a focused area, such as reducing air pollutants, greenhouse gases, pollution prevention or developed innovative approaches to cleaner air. Any public agency, private business, non-profit or school located within the <u>Air District's nine county jurisdiction</u> is encouraged to <u>register and apply</u> for the Spare the Air Leadership Award.

The award will be featured at the upcoming 2017 <u>Acterra Business Environmental Awards</u> ceremony, one of the Bay Area's oldest and most prestigious environmental recognition programs. The awards honor the accomplishments of organizations with innovative sustainable programs and recognize environmental leaders by providing an educational forum that increases awareness and the adoption of sustainable operating practices.
