Air District joins CAL FIRE, EPA & community groups to improve air quality at East Oakland elementary school

Trees and shrubs to be planted on Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service

SAN FRANCISCO - The Bay Area Air District will join representatives from CAL FIRE, Oakland Unified School District, City of Oakland, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Higher Ground, Urban Releaf and volunteers along with other members of the community for the installation of a vegetative barrier to reduce pollution and improve air quality at Brookfield Elementary School, located in East Oakland next to the high-traffic Interstate 880 freeway.
