Air District, CARB & SF community work together to reduce air pollution from big trucks

Anti-idling effort in San Francisco's Bayview District strives to Spare the Air

SAN FRANCISCO - The Bay Area Air District and partners are announcing the installation of anti-idling street signage to protect the health of Bayview residents from diesel pollution in the area surrounding the San Francisco Wholesale Produce Market. The market is a major center for the regional distribution of produce located in the Bayview District, a neighborhood heavily impacted by truck exhaust and industrial pollution.
