**NOTICE** is hereby given that the Executive Officer/Air Pollution Control Officer of the Bay Area Air Quality Management District invites interested persons to submit written public comments on the draft Renewal of the Major Facility Review Permit for the following facility:

Major facilities are required to obtain operating permits under Title V of the 1990 Clean Air Act Amendments, the Federal Operating Permit Program and the District's Regulation 2, Rule 6 - Major Facility Review. The permits summarize all air-related requirements that apply to each source of emissions at each facility. Following is the estimated change in emissions at the facility since the original permit was issued. The detail for emission changes that are less than 1 ton per year is found in the application.

The initial Title V permit for this facility was issued on December 1, 2003. Details of the previous revisions can be found in Section X of the permit "Revision History". All changes to the most recent version of the permit are clearly shown in strikeout/underline format.

The Air Pollution Control Officer invites written comment on the above draft permit renewal. Comments must be received by April 14, 2011. Any interested person may also request a public hearing for this permit.

Major Facility Review Permits are also subject to review and approval by US EPA. After the District has considered all public comments and made any necessary changes, the permit will be submitted to EPA for review. If US EPA has not objected to a proposed permit and the District has not addressed a public comment in a satisfactory manner, the public may petition US EPA, Region IX, Operating Permits Section at 75 Hawthorne Street, San Francisco, CA 94105, within 60 days after the end of US EPA's review, to reconsider the decision to not object to the permit.
