EPA Making Sensing of Air Pollution Grant

Open now (May 2024) Deadline to apply: June, 26, 2024

 Funding for community-engaged research in underserved communities to advance the use of air pollution data and communication of air quality information for empowering local

- decisions and actions that address community-identified air pollution concerns
- Eligible: Nonprofits, institutions of higher education, hospitals, federally recognized Tribal Governments, state and local government
- Up to \$1.25M. 50% of Cooperative Agreements will go to Minority Serving Institutions

EPA Community Change Grant

open now (May 2024) Deadline to apply: November 20, 2024

- Eligible projects: Climate resiliency, reducing climate and health risks, indoor/outdoor air and water pollution reduction, reducing emissions, jobs that reduce greenhouse gas or pollution, community engagement in state and federal advisory groups, workshops, rulemakings, and other public processes.
- awards: depends if you apply for track I or II, between \$1M \$20M
- deadline: 1-year rolling application now thru Nov. 20, 2024
- application template: 6-step application guides for <u>Track I</u> and <u>Track II</u>
- partner and assistance survey find local/state partners for the application.
- To access direct TA to complete Sam.gov registrations, find partners, and write applications, reach out to nonprofit <u>Environmental Protection Network (EPN)</u>.
- The EPA is also offering direct TA to help prepare Community

- Communities can also receive direct support from the Region 9
 Thriving Communities Technical Assistance Centers. We recommend CA CBOs reach out to <u>San Diego State U Center for Community Energy and Environmental Justice (CCEEJ)</u> to learn more and fill out the <u>TA request form</u>. These TA centers are funded by the EPA until 2028, so communities can rely on ongoing support as they navigate the entire grant lifecycle.

EPA Thriving Communities Grantmakers Grants

anticipated to open for applications in Fall 2024

- <u>Learn more about the Environmental Justice Thriving Communities</u>
 Grantmakers
- Subgrants through the Grantmakers are expected to become available in Fall 2024.
- This grant program will replace the EPA Small EJ Grants program and will make it easier for community groups to receive funding. Groups do not need to be a 501c3 to apply for funding, and you won't be required to have a SAM.gov registration. There's reduced reporting requirements, and you'll apply to receive funding through a community intermediary organization, not to the EPA. Be sure to check back on the EPA Grantmakers Grant page to apply this grant program should be open for applications in spring/summer 2024.
- Tier One will consist of grants for \$150,000 for assessment, Tier
 Two will consist of grants for \$250,000 for planning, and Tier Three
 will consist of grants for \$350,000 for project development. In
 addition, \$75,000 will be available for capacity-constrained
 community-based organizations through a noncompetitive process
 under Tier One. Each Grantmaker will design and implement a
 distribution program best suited for their region and communities.

California State Funding Programs

There are a number of large programs under the CA Climate Resilience Package and CA Air Protection Program (AB 617) that will be moving into Round 2 funding next year. You can learn more at CA State Programs for Climate-Related <u>funding tracker</u>, and just to highlight a few:

<u>Community Air Resources Board Community Air Grants</u> - anticipate starting outreach in late Spring/Summer 2024

- Educational projects maximum award for Cycle 4 was \$100,000
- Technical or Targeted projects maximum award for Cycle 4 was \$300,000
- All projects must be wholly located in and benefit disadvantaged and low-income communities
- There will be another round of funding for community air grants this year (Cycle 5, with possibility of a different or increased amount than the amounts listed here, which reflect Cycle 4 funding). They anticipate starting outreach in late Spring/early Summer 2024.

<u>Adaptation Planning Grant Program</u> - Round 2 open now (May 2024) - Deadline: June 3, 2024

- Provides funding to help fill local, regional, and tribal planning needs, provides communities the resources to identify climate resilience priorities, and supports the development of a pipeline of climate-resilient infrastructure projects across the state.
- \$9.5M in funding available. Applications can request between \$100,000 and \$650,000 in total state funding for planning projects spanning twenty-four months.
- Note: Planning Grant Applicants must submit the "Pre-Application Interest Form" in order to receive the link to submit applications
- Eligible to apply: Local Public Entities, California Native American Tribes, Community-based Organizations. Note: Community-based organizations should partner with a local public entity or Tribe.
- To aid the development of competitive Proposals, APGP will provide application TA to eligible Applicants through a thirdparty provider (Civix).

Regional Resilience Planning & Implementation Grant Program

Round 2 expected to open Spring or Summer 2024

- The ICARP Regional Resilience Planning and Implementation
 Grant Program funds public entities, California Native American
 tribes, Community-Based Organizations, and academic
 institutions that form regional partnerships to plan and
 implement projects that advance climate resilience and respond
 to the greatest climate risks in their regions.
- Funding for planning and implementation grants in the \$500,000-\$3M range.
